**Weekend Mass Sign-up**—**You must sign up WEEKLY** through the parish office for the weekend masses as we can only accommodate 30 people per mass. Also, if you sign up to attend, then change your plans, we would really appreciate a phone call or email to let us know so we can make room for others.
