Prayer Table Supplies

In the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atria, the center of our room is the prayer table. It is a place of personal contemplation and communal sharing amongst the children. It is also a wonderful place of reflection and prayer in the home and a wonderful way to invite the entire family to learn and pray together.

To get you started we will have a limited number of prayer table supplies, in a kit, available soon. These kits will contain, prayer table cloths (4 for each color of the liturgical seasons), candle, basic prayer cards (Amen, Alleluia), Good Shepherd icon, card stand, holy water font (small bowl), holy water, small vase, parent pages, and monthly liturgical calendar. All you have to provide is a small space in your home and a small table of some kind (can be a bench, stool, old nightstand, etc).

Reading I: Ezekiel 18:25-28 (personal responsibility)

Reading II: Philippians 2:1-11 (imitating the humility of Christ)

Gospel: Matthew 21:28-32 (parable of the two sons)

Key Passage: A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, "Son, go and work in the vineyard today." He answered, "I will not"; but later he changed his mind and went. The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, "I go, sir"; but he did not go. Which of the two did the will of his father? They said, "The first." (Matthew 21:28-31)

Adult: When have your actions not measured up to your promises? What was the outcome?

Child: Why is it important to follow through on your promises to others?
